Living Lands – The Organization

The vision of Living Lands involves 'collaborations working on living landscapes'*, which represents the connection amongst stakeholders and the undertaking of a learning process that ultimately leads to social awareness and raises collective action towards more sustainable practices in a defined area. This is done by means of employing a social change approach as a way to engage stakeholders in a participatory process. Research and trial experimentation are part of the knowledge created for supporting stakeholders' decision making. We are currently a team of 10, with offices in the Baviaanskloof, Langkloof and Cape Town. We are a young and dynamic bunch who like to do things differently. We are driven by change; we're all passionate about our work and enjoy a flat working structure. We like to work with a positive, creative, committed, honest, and transparent approach.

As an apprentice you will be learning on the job, supporting the senior staff in the organization and begin managing smaller projects. Depending on your experience and progress, you will assume more responsibilities with the goal of becoming a full time landscape mobiliser after a year.

*A 'living landscape' comprises a variety of healthy ecosystems and land uses and is home to ecological, agricultural and social systems which are managed so as to function sustainably.





General Requirements

In general, for all three available positions, candidates should have an interest in stakeholder engagement, social change processes, nature conservation, restoration and sustainable land/water management, and possess managerial abilities. The following criteria apply:

- At least a Honours degree;
- Experience (or interested in learning) in managing stakeholder processes;
- Excellent communication and network skills, on all levels;
- Good project management skills;
- Team player;
- Ability to listen and have empathy with stakeholder experiences;
- Ability to connect with stakeholders of varying backgrounds and income levels;
- Valid Driver's license and vehicle;
- Previous experience is an advantage;
- IT proficiency to a self-supporting standard in Microsoft Office applications;
- Fluency in English and Afrikaans is essential and isiXhosa is a pre.

Role Description – Apprentice Landscape Mobiliser (1 X Eastern Cape; 1 X Western Cape)

We are looking for **two** highly motivated and professional Landscape Mobilisers. The primary function of the position is to work together and assisting in social learning/change processes on landscapes with all stakeholders – landowners, communities, farmers, municipalities, universities, private and government agencies – to build a collective understanding of the current challenges and aspirations and create a collective strategies and action.

The landscape mobiliser is responsible for the bottom based stakeholder engagement process based on the living landscape approach. This approach is an integration of social learning, Theory U, ecosystem thinking and transdisciplinary knowledge production.

You will need to be able to multi-task, and be flexible and social in your approach.

Responsibilities (after a year in the position):

- Engage and build trust with local stakeholders;
- Mobilizing and connecting divergent groups of stakeholders at the landscape level: land-users, communities, NGOs and government;
- Form and maintain mutually beneficial partnerships with key organisations and contacts;
- Organise learning events and workshops;
- Organise field journey to stakeholders and partners;







- Implement and manage different projects on the landscape, including administration, budgets, planning, logistics and reporting;
- Represent Living Lands at meetings and workshops,
- Proposal writing;
- Pick-up and elaborate on new ideas; shaping something innovative which has never been done before
- Alignment with Living Lands' vision and strategy,
- Professional communications related to the projects;

Role Description – Apprentice Knowledge Broker (Eastern Cape)

We are looking for a highly motivated and professional Knowledge Broker. The primary function of this is to lay the foundations for the smooth and successful function of Living Lands Research programme. Specifically, the role requires the Knowledge Broker to take the lead in the research and monitoring programme and strategy development and implementation of the research and monitoring, creating learning opportunities, dissemination of information, networking and partner interaction. Specifically, the role requires the coordination and the initiation of existing and new research projects respectively.

Responsibilities (after a year in the position):

- Assist in the coordination of existing research projects.
- Assist in the coordination of initiating new research projects
- Assist with the monitoring programme
